AICCC is an interdisciplinary conference open to scholars, stakeholders and more generally citizens concerned by Climate Change.

Submission of abstracts for papers or posters

Both empirical and theoretical contributions, from any discipline, in either French or English, are welcome. A two-page abstract (Times New Roman, 12, references included), in PDF format, is requested by **March 18, 2024** (extended deadline). Submissions must be made through the conference website <https://aicc2.sciencesconf.org/> and should contain the following details:

- Communication title
- Main discipline of the communication
- Author(s)' name(s), affiliation(s), email address(es)
- Submission for oral presentation only/Poster presentation only/either oral or poster presentation
- Regarding oral presentation: English only/French only/either English or French.

Authors have the flexibility to submit multiple papers. Upon submission, an acknowledgment of receipt will be issued. Each submitted contribution will be reviewed by two peers: one from the discipline stated in submission and one from another discipline. Notification of acceptance or rejection for the oral/poster presentation will be communicated via email before April 1, 2024.

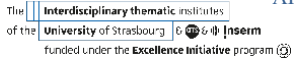
